A basic summary of recruitment information includes:


- 2,885 applications

Caring responsibilities²





Disability³



Ethnicity



Gender



49% of **applicants** were male (51%, 2014-15). 42% of those **appointed** were male (41%, 2014-15).


Gender identity

Religion





46% of **applicants** stated that they had no religion (39%, 2014-15), 33% were Christian (36%, 2014-15), 6% were Muslim (7%, 2014-15).

Of those **appointed**, 52% declared that they had no religion (43%, 2014-15), 32% Christian (31%, 2014-15), 4% were Muslim (4%, 2014-15).

There were 4 people interviewed who were Buddhist, however, this is not shown in the above chart due to rounding of data to the nearest whole %.

Sexual Orientation

6% of **applicants** stated they were either gay, lesbian or bisexual (4%, 2014-15). 6% of **applicants** preferred not answer this question (6%, 2014-15),

Of those appointed, 6% stated they were gay, lesbian or bisexual (4%, 2014-15).
