#### Commentary

- The % of **Home/EU** students under 21 awarded a I or II(i) has increased over the period (+1%)
- The % of **overseas** students under 21 awarded a I or II(i) has increased over the period (+7%)
- For **both Home/EU and Overseas**, the percentage of students aged 21 or over achieving a I or II (i) is lower than students aged under 21. For example, Home/EU – 2014/15 & 2015/16 there is an 18% gap. This gap is smaller for Overseas students e.g. it stands at 2% for 2015/16.

### Commentary

- The % of students with a disability achieving a I or II (i) is lower than students without a disability. For example, Home/EU, 2014/15 & 2015/16 there is a 5% attainment gap.
- There has been a 15% increase in the % of overseas disabled students achieving a I or II (i) over the period (54% in 2013/14 and 69% in 2015/16, however it is important to note that there are very low numbers in this category).

### Commentary

- For Home/EU and Overseas students, the % of students from a BME background awarded a I or II(i) is consistently lower than white students across the period.
- For Home/EU students the attainment gap in 2015/16 was 11% (compared to 15% in 2014/15 & 12% in 2013/14). For Overseas students this gap was 33% (11% in 2014/15 and 19% in 2013/14).

#### Commentary

- The % of male Home/EU students awarded a I or II(i) is lower than females across the period, and this gap has increased (2013/14 – 4%, 2015/16 – 7%).
- The % of male overseas students awarded a I or II(i) was higher than females in 2015/16 (by 1%) whereas previously a higher % of females than males were awarded a I or II(i).
