

University of Leeds student admissions 2019-20 by protected characteristic

The following information provides data on all students (undergraduate (UG), taught postgraduate (PGT) and research postgraduate (PGR)) who applied for a course during the last admissions cycle. The data are provided by the following protected characteristics: age; disability; ethnicity; gender; religion or belief, and sexual orientation.

For each protected characteristic, the data are broken down by the following three stages of the University's admissions cycle: applications; offers; acceptances.

The data from the previous year (2018-19) are provided for comparison.

Home/EU and overseas data have been presented separately.

Data are rounded to the nearest whole percent and therefore may not always total 100%.

Commentary

- i. Undergraduate- The split across age groups between UG Home/EU applications for 2018-19 and 2019-20 remains similar with 93% of UG applications being made by those under 21 years and 7% from those who are 21 or over. The percentage of applicants who were offered a place of study remains lower for those 21 and over than for those under 21 (35% and 68% respectively). The percentage of those offered a place who accepted decreased by 2% for the under 21 age group (20% in 2018-19 decreasing to 18% in 2019-20) but increased by 5% in the 21 or over age group (47% in 2018-19 to 52% in 2019-20).
- ii. Taught Postgraduate- There was a 2% decrease in the percentage of PGT applications from Home/EU students under 25 years (58% in 2018-19 decreasing to 56% in 2019-20) and a corresponding increase in the percentage of students who were 25 or over. Offers made to PGT applicants who were under 25 decreased by 9% from 79% in 2018-19 to 70% in 2019-20.

Offers for those who were 25 or over have decreased slightly from 73% to 71%. The percentage of acceptances from PGT students who were under 25 increased by 2% (from 57% to 59%). Acceptances from those aged 25 or over remained at 75% across the two year period.

- iii. Research Postgraduate- The split of applications for Home/EU PGR students between the under 25 age group and the 25 or over age group has shifted slightly to 40%/60% respectively across the two year period. Applicants who were made an offer of a place to study has increased from 28% to 31% for the under 25 age group but decreased slightly from 32% to 31% for the 25 and over age group over the two year period. Acceptances have increased for the 25 and over age group (from 73% to 76%), but decreased slightly for the under 25 age group (from 78% to 77%).

Commentary

- i. Undergraduate- Applications from overseas UG students who were under 21 years increased by 1% over the two year period (87% in 2018-19 to 88% in 2019-20). There has been a 1% decrease in the percentage of UG students who were 21 or over (13% in 2018-19 to 12% in 2019-20). Offers have increased over the two year period for UG students for both age groups (63% to 68% for the under 21 group and 47% to 51% for the 21 or over group). The percentage of offers accepted by overseas UG students who were under 21 has increased by 2%, and there was a 4% increase in the percentage of UG students who were 21 or over who accepted an offer of a place.
- ii. Taught Postgraduate- Applications from overseas PGT students who were under 25 increased by 1% over the two year period. There was a 1% decrease in applications from those who were 25 or over. Offers made to PGT students who were under 25 decreased by 13% across the period and there was a 9% decrease in offers made to those who were 25 or over. Acceptances from the overseas PGT who were under 25 remained at 21% across the two years and acceptances from the 25 or over group decreased from 38% to 34%.
- iii. Research Postgraduate- The percentage of PGR applications from the under 25 age group remained at 9% between years. The percentage of offers made to PGR students who were 25 or over increased by 1% across the two year period, while the percentage of offers made to PGR students who were under 25 increased by 2%. Acceptance of offers to overseas PGR students decreased by 9% for the under 25 age group and increased by 1% for the 25 or over age group.

Commentary

- i. Undergraduate- The percentage of applications from UG Home/EU students who declared a disability increased by 1% across the two year period. Offers made to disabled students remained at 66%. Acceptances of places decreased by 2% for both disabled students and students with no known disability.
- ii. Taught Postgraduate- The percentage of applications from PGT Home/EU disabled students remained at 10%. Offers made to students with a disability decreased by 2% across the two year period from 81% to 79%. Acceptances from disabled PGT students decreased by 3% to 71%.

¹ Disability is defined under the Equality Act 2010 as a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long-term negative effect on a person's ability to carry out normal daily activities.

- iii. Research Postgraduate- The percentage of applications received from those who declared a disability decreased by 1% to 10%. Offers made to those with a disability decreased by 4% to 32%, and acceptances from disabled students decreased from 76% to 74% over the two year period.

Commentary

- i. Undergraduate- There was a 1% increase across the two year period in applications from overseas UG students who declared a disability. Offers of places made to disabled applicants decreased by 6% to 60%. Acceptance of offers from overseas UG students who declared a disability increased by 5% across the two years to 19%.

- ii. Taught Postgraduate- Overseas PGT applicants who declared a disability made up fewer than 1% of applications across the two year period. Offers of places made to disabled applicants decreased by 14% to 57%. Acceptance of offers to overseas PGT students who declared a disability decreased by 8% to 53%.
- iii. Research Postgraduate- Overseas PGR applicants who declared a disability made up 1% of applications across the two year period. Offers of places made to disabled applicants decreased to 30%, while acceptance of offers from overseas PGR students who declared a disability increased to 86%.

Commentary

- i. Undergraduate- The percentage of applications from UG Home/EU BME students increased by 2% across the two year period from 22% to 24%. There was a 1% decrease in the percentage of applications made by white students. The percentage of students whose ethnicity is unknown decreased from 11% to 10%. Offers made to white students increased slightly to 71% across the two years, while offers made to BME students decreased slightly to 50% from 51%. Acceptances of places decreased for both BME and white students (to 19% and 20% respectively).

- ii. Taught Postgraduate- The percentage of applications from PGT Home/EU BME students increased by 1% across the two year period to 19%. The percentage of applications made by white students decreased slightly to 60%. The percentage of students whose ethnicity is unknown remains at 21%. Offers made to white students decreased by 5% to 76%. Offers made to BME students remained lower, at 65%. Acceptances of places decreased for both BME and white students (to 73% and 71% respectively).
- iii. Research Postgraduate- The percentage of applications from PGR Home/EU BME students increased by 3% across the two year period to 21%. The percentage of applications made by white students decreased by 1% to 63%. The percentage of students whose ethnicity is unknown decreased from 18% to 16%. Offers made to white students increased slightly to 33% and offers made to BME applicants remained lower, at 17%. Acceptances of places increased for BME applicants from 75% to 78% over the two year period, while acceptances from white PGR applicants decreased slightly to 80%.

Commentary

- i. Undergraduate- While these data are provided for transparency, the percentage of unknown ethnicity data for UG overseas applicants is high (98%) and as such, it may be difficult to meaningfully compare data across academic years.
- ii. Taught Postgraduate- The percentage of applications from PGT Overseas BME students decreased by 1% to 78%. The percentage of applications made by white students decreased to 1% across the two years. The percentage of students whose ethnicity is unknown increased slightly to 21%. Offers made to white students decreased by 7% to 58% while offers made to BME students decreased by 13% to 51%. Acceptances of places increased for white students to 30% while remaining at 27% for BME students across the two years.
- iii. Research Postgraduate- The percentage of applications from PGR overseas BME students remained at 69%. The percentage of applications made by white students decreased slightly to 4%. The percentage of students whose ethnicity is unknown remained at 26%. Offers made to white students increased by 3% across the two years to 24%, while offers made to BME applicants increased to 13%. Acceptance of places decreased slightly for BME applicants to 63%, while acceptances from white PGR applicants increased by 6% to 59%.

Commentary

- i. Undergraduate- The percentage of Home/EU UG applicants who were female remained at 57% and the percentage of male students remained at 43%. Offers made to female applicants remained at 66% across the two years, whilst offers made to male applicants decreased slightly to 64%. Acceptance of offers decreased for both female and male applicants by 2%.

- ii. Taught Postgraduate- Home/EU PGT applicants who were female decreased by 1% to 58%, while male applicants remained at 41%. The percentage of offers made to female applicants decreased by 5% to 72%, while the percentage of offers made to male applicants decreased by 9% to 68%. Acceptance of offers from female students increased slightly to 68% and the acceptance rate for male students increased slightly to 63%.
- iii. Research Postgraduate- Female Home/EU PGR applicants accounted for 46% of applications across the period while male applicants accounted for 54% of applications. The percentage of offers made to female applicants remained at 32% while the percentage of offers made to male applicants increased by 1% to 30%. Acceptance of offers from female students increased from 76% to 82% whilst the acceptance rate for male students decreased from 74% to 72%.

Commentary

- i. Undergraduate- Female overseas UG applicants accounted for 54% of applications while male overseas UG applicants accounted for 46% of applications. Offers increased for both female and male applicants (by 6% and 5% respectively). Acceptances increased to 19% for female overseas UG applicants and 18% for male applicants.
- ii. Taught Postgraduate- The percentage of Overseas PGT applicants who were female decreased by 1% to 63%, while there was a 1% increase in male applicants to 37%. The percentage of offers made to female applicants decreased to 53%, while the percentage of offers made to male applicants decreased to 52%. Acceptance of offers from female students remained at 24% whilst the acceptance rate for male students decreased by 1% to 28%.
- iii. Research Postgraduate- There has been a 2% increase in female overseas PGR applicants across the two years to 45% and a 2% decrease in male applicants to 55%. The percentage of offers made to female applicants increased by 2% to 22%, while the percentage of offers made to male applicants increased from 18% to 19%. Acceptance of offers from female students increased by 1% to 65% while the acceptance rate for male students decreased slightly to 64%.

Commentary

There has been no change in the percentages for the applications data.

Offers to those who stated that they have a religion or belief decreased by 2% over the two year period. The percentage of offers to people who declared that they did not have a religion increased by 1% over the two year period.

Acceptance of offers by those with no religion or belief has decreased by 3% to 20%. There has also been a 3% decrease in the percentage of acceptances from students who declared that they had a religion or belief.

b) Overseas

These data are taken from UCAS applications and, as such, is only available for UG students. Whilst data have been provided for transparency, the high levels of unknown religion or belief data (98%) mean that it may be difficult to draw meaningful conclusions.

Commentary

There has been no change in the percentages for applicant data.

Offers made to LGB and Other applicants increased from 67% to 68% across the two year period. The percentage of offers made to heterosexual applicants has decreased slightly to 63%. Acceptances of a place of study decreased by 3% for LGB and Other applicants and by 4% for Heterosexual applicants.

b) Overseas

These data are taken from UCAS applications and, as such, are only available for UG students. Whilst data have been provided for transparency, the high levels of unknown sexual orientation data (98%) mean that it may be difficult to draw meaningful conclusions.
